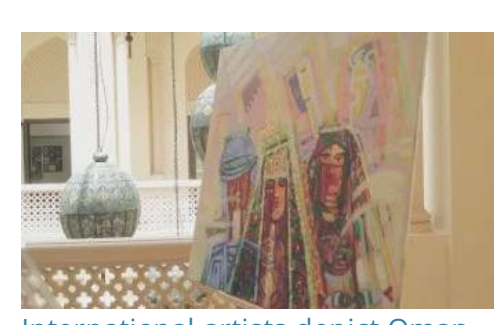

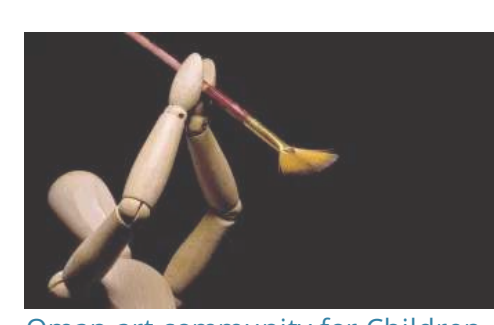
Moosa Omar has held previously around 14 private exhibitions in the Sultanate, Bahrain, Egypt, Kuwait, Qatar and his last exhibition was held in Mannheim, Germany, which was organised by Gallery Kunst. His work has also been displayed in various exhibitions in the Gulf and the world, and has hosted various exhibitions in a number of European countries, including USA, Mexico, Turkey, Iraq, Pakistan, India, Algeria, Morocco, Taiwan, Lebanon, Australia, Korea South, Egypt, Japan, Jordan, Syria, Bangladesh and China. He has participated in several technical workshops and is also a member at the Unesco International Federation of Arts, the Oman Society of Fine Arts (OSFA) and the Youth Workshop. He has won numerous artistic awards from Oman, Egypt, Australia, Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Kuwait. He has been honoured in several countries and his works are shown in many galleries, salons and art museums in various parts of the world.

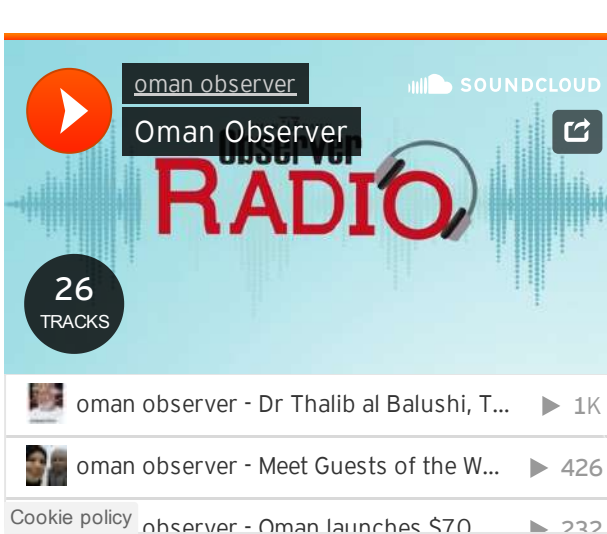
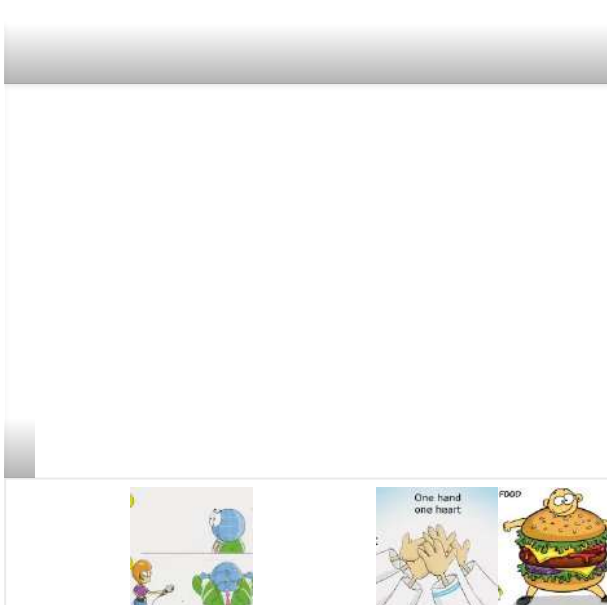

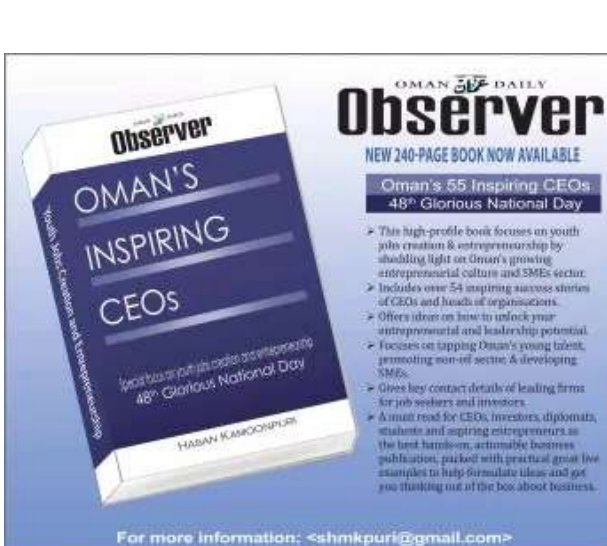
